

THE MISSION BEHIND SLP



Entrepreneurship is a chance to chase one's dreams. This is an extraordinary privilege, which is sometimes lost in the struggles of being an entrepreneur.

We live in a time when over one billion people cannot read or write, and 700 million

people live in abject poverty. In the US alone, one in five children faces food insecurity. Seven million children will die this year from preventable causes.

This is the collective responsibility and the shame of our generation.

So SLP was started as a not-for-profit, with the idea that over time, we would create a network that could make a collective impact.

We have always chosen our Fellows carefully, admitting high-caliber individuals with heart, with demonstrated evidence of helping others. We give these individuals a high-class education and network for life.

In the final class called **"Reflections & How I will change the World"** our Fellows make a public commitment that, whether they fail or succeed on their entrepreneurial journeys, they would use their **talent, wealth or resources** to help those who less fortunate.

We began in Boston in 2006 with seven outstanding innovators and entrepreneurs. We were inspired in creating our unique structure by two organizations. **Room to Read** taught us that it was important that the

participants own the program. In staying lean, we were inspired by **Akshaya Patra**, who provides 1.6 million free meals daily at poor schools so parents would be motivated to send their children to school.

Our growth is thanks to our mission and our extraordinary, giving, big-hearted and high-caliber Fellows who have volunteered their time over the years to educate our entrepreneurs and strengthen our network. Through this brochure, we welcome you to share our own impact, the amazing work our Fellows are doing to help those less fortunate, either through their own products, and startups, or through the startups they support.

EXTRAORDINARY ORGANISATIONS WE WORK WITH

The Five Organisations We Supported In The Past Year Are:



AKSHAYA PATRA is the world's largest feeding program, providing free food to 1.6 million children in schools. The Akshaya Patra Foundation is a not-for-profit organisation that strives to fight issues like hunger and malnutrition in India, by implementing the Mid-Day Meal Scheme in the government schools and government-aided schools and also brings children to school. \$28 will feed a child a nutritious meal from high-technology kitchens for an entire year. It was an inspiration behind the way we structured SLP, where our Fellows always get a meal.

ROOM TO READ is the world's largest builder of libraries and schools. They seek to transform the lives of millions of children in developing countries by focusing on literacy and gender equality in education. John Wood's incredible book inspired SLP to model itself on similar principles. While SLP provides the infrastructure, curriculum and network, the Fellows run the Program, thereby vesting them.






EDUCATE GIRLS

provides education in educationally backward regions through a 24-week long learning curriculum implemented in grades 3, 4 and 5 with a focus on building micro-competencies. Educate Girls is holistically tackling issues at the


root cause of gender inequality in India's education system that has helped to ensure over 90% enrollment and significantly higher attendance for all girls as well as improved school infrastructure, quality of education and learning outcomes for all children. SLP is financing the kit called "Gyaan ka Pitaara" (The Wealth of Knowledge) containing 3,000 pieces including 300 worksheets in English, Hindi and Mathematics.



RISE MALAWI a school by UrbanPromise is dedicated to providing children and youth with the support that they need to succeed academically, grow spiritually, and prepare for

leadership that will bring positive change to their own communities. SLP is seeking to provide books, bags & clothing for high school girls through RISE MALAWI. One of our Fellows, and former Program Leader & Board Member, Rebecca Boudreaux spearheaded fundraising to build a dorm for these girls.





Danish Shaikh from Kranti:

“At the age of 8 I left my mom to live in a shelter. My father died when I was 6, so my mom resumed sex work to feed me and my three sisters, including one who is deaf and mute. From childhood I was told that I should have limited dreams. I wasn't allowed to dream of being a journalist or an actress because my whole life, I was told "a whore's daughter can only become whore." Even my teachers told me this. But this all changed when I joined Kranti, an NGO which empowers daughters of sex workers.

Kranti teaches us to be agents of social change - and

KRANTI educates and empowers trafficked girls, the daughters of sex workers, and otherwise socially marginalized girls to become agents of social change within their communities. By providing them with a healing home, formal and extracurricular education, leadership and job training, as well as the skills and confidence to solve social problems, Kranti enables the Krantikaris to emerge as leaders and economic assets, redefining the value of women in Indian society. Through therapy, workshops, travel, theater, and education, Kranti transforms their lives. These girls have given TedX Talks, spoken on national and international platforms and studied in India and abroad on scholarships. SLP is providing tutors for entrance exams.



happiness. Here I got many opportunities to grow, especially through therapy and travel. Therapy really shaped my life and helped me to come out of the trauma and violence in my past. And thanks to travel, I have another passion too. In 2016 I got scholarship to study in Israel 3 months, and in 2017 I volunteered in Thailand NGO 3 months. Now I want to study psychology to help others heal and change their lives like Kranti changed mine.

I chose this college because I think they value my life and work experience - it is so focused on helping students become compassionate, reflective citizens. I think here I can reach my full potential and have a real impact on other marginalized people after I graduate. But I need your help! I applied for scholarships, but even that won't cover all of my tuition and housing costs. Will you help me fund my studies so I can support my family and also many more marginalized communities??”

SLP 5K RUN



True to SLP's Mission, the 5K Run/Walk adopts a theme, picks related NGO/s and then runs for the cause. This year's theme was creating awareness and raising funds for girl child education and health. SLP's network of outstanding founders, leaders, VCs and innovators put on their running shoes in support of this cause. It was also attended by startup ecosystem partners, enthusiasts and the general public willing to support the initiative. The 5K Run/Walk took place across three cities in India - Delhi, Hyderabad and Pune. Last year, SLP Hyderabad organised the SLP 5k Neon Run that raised about 6 lakhs, which was later donated to NGOs - Kishori Vikas and Sankalp.

SLP supported 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' with the following organizations this year -

Maher Ashram - Proceedings from the Run/Walk will go towards helping destitute girl children, from all over India, receive the highest quality diet, medical attention and psychiatric counseling.

Pratyusha Support - Proceedings from the Run/Walk will go towards helping girls suffering from life-threatening medical conditions with unparalleled medical support.

Sankalp Foundation - Proceedings from the Run/Walk will go towards the development of destitute and orphaned children by providing the basic needs with quality education in a child-friendly and healthy atmosphere.

Voice Of Slum - Proceedings from the Run/Walk will go towards providing the basic necessities of health, education and shelter to the children staying in slums


